INC., and NEW ENGLAND WIRE PRODUCTS INC., have no objection, it is hereby ORDERED AND ADJUDGED;

1. This Court has previously entered an Order on Confidentiality Agreement and Protective Order on April 3, 2018.

2. This is a premises liability negligence case.

3. Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420 and the Order on Confidentiality Agreement and Protective Order entered on April 3, 2018 are the particular grounds that determine confidentiality for purposes of this motion.

4. No parties names nor any portion of the caption shall be confidential.

5. No progress dockets shall be confidential.

6. Any portion of Plaintiff's soon-to-be-filed Motion to Amend Complaint to Add Claim for Punitive Damages, within the body of the motion itself or its exhibits attached thereto, that relate

to or reference Home Depot company policies or training materials; (b) any portion of any response or reply by Home Depot to said motion that relates to or references those same documents; and (c) any order by this Court on said motion, to the extent it expressly references specific portions of Home Depot's policies and/or training materials, shall heretofore be confidential.

7. This Court, the parties to this lawsuit, as well as any of their agents or attorneys as specified in Order on Confidentiality Agreement and Protective Order, are permitted to view the confidential information.

8. This Court finds the degree, duration, and manner of confidentiality ordered by the Court are no broader than necessary to protect the interests set forth in Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420(c).

9. The Clerk of the Court is directed to publish the order in accordance with Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420(e)(4).
